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SCHOLARSHIPS

SHORT-TERM WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT (STWD) SCHOLARSHIP

The Short-Term Workforce Development (STWD) Grant Program is a state-funded financial aid program for eligible Workforce Continuing Education (WCE) students pursuing high-demand, family-sustaining wage credentials identified as NC Workforce Credentials at either the Essential or Career level. These credential pathways may consist of a single WCE course or a series of courses. The list of eligible credentials is available at https://nccareers.org/list-credentials.

USE OF SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS

Scholarship awards are determined based on student needs, local industry needs, number of eligible students and cost of course (up to a maximum of \$750 per course). The scholarships help cover the cost of tuition, fees, books, supplies, credentialing tests, transportation, childcare and other components of the total cost of attendance.

STUDENT ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

At a minimum, eligible students must be:

A Resident of North Carolina

Students must establish residency under the centralized residency determination process administered by the State Education Assistance Authority known as the NC Residency Determination Service (RDS).

Enrolling in Workforce Continuing Education

Some funds are available to students who are taking certain workforce continuing education courses.

APPLICATION PROCESS

Students must complete the STWD scholarship application found at www.stanly.edu/financial-aid/occupational-scholarships.html and submit to SCC's Financial Aid office. Once approved, all awards and notifications are issued by the Financial Aid office.

GOLDEN LEAF SCHOLARSHIP

The Golden Leaf Foundation provides scholarships of up to \$500 during one term for occupational continuing education students enrolled in a credentialing program of at least 96 hours. The scholarship funds are limited to tuition, books, fees, supplies, credential testing fees for mid-skills training courses, childcare services, and transportation necessary to fulfill student educational requirements. You must be a resident of one of the qualifying eligible counties and be enrolled in, or plan to enroll in, one of the participating community colleges in North Carolina. Criteria include: must reside in an eligible county, provide 2022 adjusted gross income, and be enrolled in credentialing program of at least 96 hours.

SECU FOUNDATION - STATE EMPLOYEE CREDIT UNION SCHOLARSHIPS

Introduced by the SECU Foundation, this program focuses on assisting unemployed and underemployed adults, military veterans and members of the National Guard with marketable job skills that lead to sustainable wage careers within their local communities. Participants must be enrolled in a program that leads to a state-recognized or industry-supported credential. Eligible students will be awarded \$500 scholarships at each of the 58 NC Community College campuses.

ADVANCED MANUFACTURING, INDUSTRY & TRADES

AUTO BODY RESTORATION AUT 310906, AUT 310901

This course is designed to prepare the student for an entry-level position in the auto body restoration field. The training is graduated based upon the student's skill and experience. Course topics will include a study of automobile construction and design, removing and installing parts, cutting materials, metalworking, welding, painting, use of tools, safety procedures, and other related topics.

ADVANCED MANUFACTURING, INDUSTRY & TRADES

ELECTRICAL LINEWORKER TRAINING ELT 301801

This training program will provide students the knowledge and climbing skills necessary to enter the field of power distribution as an Electrical Lineworker. Electrical Lineworkers install or make repairs to electrical power distribution systems. This is a rewarding career that requires dedicated employees who work well as a team and like to work outdoors. The program meets daily for 12 weeks for a minimum of 350 hours.

Course topics include:

- Basic elements of electricity
- Overhead pole and electrical line construction
- Safety codes and applications
- Underground training
- Electric power system, transformer and meter installations
- CDL overview
- · Workzone flagger
- OHSA 10-Hour Construction Training
- CPR/First Aid Training

Upon completion, individuals will possess the necessary skills for employment in various electrical utility industries. Employers require a minimum of 18 years of age, no felony convictions in the last seven years, and a valid drivers license. Preference is given to applicants who possess a CDL certification.



QMS ROADWAY TECH RECERTIFICATION

SEF 300112

An in-depth re-certification only course for the purpose of re-certifying asphalt roadway technicians in inspection techniques related to hauling, laydown, and compaction of asphalt pavements. Also includes in-depth training on NC Department of Transportation specifications, density requirements, recertification and acceptable laydown criteria of asphalt materials under the NCDOT HMA/QMS Program Course #MAT535T. Pre-requisites: Introduction to Asphalt Pavements, Roadway On-the-Job Training, and Initial QMS Roadway Technician completions.

E-NOTARY LEX 387501

In preparation to become an Electronic Notary Public, this course explores the legal, ethical, and procedural requirements of the Notary Act set forth in the General Statute 10B Article 2. To take this course, students must hold a valid commission as a notary public in North Carolina, and provide official identification (ie: driver's license) and current Notary Public number. Electronic notary booklets are included in the course registration fee.

MANICURIST TECHNICIAN COS 310101

This course provides instruction and clinical practice in manicuring, nail building, and pedicuring. Course content includes nail anatomy, disorders of nails, and irregularities of nails; theory and salesmanship as it relates to manicuring; actual practice in manicuring; and arm, hand, and foot massage. Students must complete 300 hours in an approved beauty school or college before applying to the State Board of Cosmetic Arts for examination. Additional costs will apply for required supplies.



In addition, students must pass the final exam at 80% or higher, submit an application and fee to North Carolina Department of the Secretary of State, and take the "oath" at the Register of Deeds office. Successful candidates must purchase their seal and stamp.

PERSONAL PROPERTY APPRAISER BUS 400001

This course explores the elements of an appraisal, how to find values, and an overview of what the Uniform Standards of Professional Appraisal Practice (USPAP) requires. Participants learn about rules, ethics, classic cars, coins, furniture, art, etc., and how to produce an effective report. This course requires both classroom time and outside lab work to complete the required 48 hours.

COLLEGE & CAREER READINESS

ADULT BASIC SKILLS PROGRAM (ABE)

These classes are designed to assist students in improving their reading, math and writing skills. Students must attend a one-day orientation on campus in order to register for the program. Classes are free and can be taken online or in a seated classroom.

HIGH SCHOOL EQUIVALENCY (HSE)

These classes prepare students for the five subject area tests to achieve the High School Equivalency Diploma. The subject tests for the HSE Diploma are reading, writing, math, science and social studies. Students must attend a one-day orientation on campus to register for the program. Classes are free and can be taken online or in a seated classroom.

ADULT HIGH SCHOOL (AHS)

This program is designed to give students who left high school prior to graduating an opportunity to take the classes they still need to meet the 22-credit requirement set by the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction in conjunction with Stanly County Board of Education. Upon completion of the program, students receive a diploma sanctioned by the Stanly County Board of Education and Stanly Community College. Prospective students will need to have an official high school transcript to enroll in the program. The classes are free and can be taken online or in a seated classroom

ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE (ESL)

This class is for adults who want to improve their English speaking, reading and writing skills. Classes are free and are held at our Albemarle Campus, Crutchfield Education Center in Locust and the Stanly County Family YMCA in Albemarle.



CAREER READINESS CERTIFICATE (CRC)

The ACT WorkKeys assessment test is intended to assess workplace abilities that influence job performance. Students are tested in literacy and math skills appropriate to the workplace. A free preparatory class is offered to students who qualify for the Human Resource Development program.

HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (HRD)

This program offers opportunities for students to improve their skills in computer literacy, managing money, resume writing and overall employment skills. Qualified individuals such as those underemployed or unemployed may take these classes free of charge. These classes are seated and are offered at many sites throughout Stanly County.











COMPUTER & TECHNOLOGY

DIGITAL PHOTOGRAPHY CERTIFICATION

This six-course certificate program is designed to provide students with knowledge and skills in photography and design. Courses include Introduction to Digital Photography, Advanced Digital Photography, Photoshop for Digital Photography, Destination, Photography Practicum, and Visual Storytelling and Design. To ensure students are contacted when the next program begins, they can register on the interest list at stanly. edu/continuing-education/technology-courses/digital-photography-certificate-program.html

INTRO TO DIGITAL PHOTOGRAPHY PHO 300112

This course will provide a thorough overview of choosing and evaluating digital cameras, allow students to work with camera manuals, memory cards, and composition basics. The students will also work with memory cards and image review, work with customized camera settings, explore exposure, resolution, compression, and file formats. The student will learn to adjust color with white balance settings, along with outputting to printers and the Web. Students in this class will use their own required Digital SLR camera.

ADVANCED DIGITAL PHOTOGRAPHY PHO 300113

Advanced Digital Photography will provide an excelled understanding of using the camera's manual settings by reviewing the key elements of the Introduction to Digital Photography class. Students will have weekly assignments discussed in class that will help take their pictures to the professional level. Additionally, each student will be able to choose an editing software that works best for them and how to shoot and edit RAW files. Camera required. Prerequisite: Intro to Digital Photography.

ADOBE PHOTOSHOP FOR DIGITAL PHOTOGRAPHY

PHO 300114

This course teaches the tools and techniques of Adobe Photoshop CC. This course teaches the student to turn their images into dynamic photographs by adding text to photos, adding, or deleting a person or persons in a photograph, advanced editing techniques, and how to restore and repair old photographs. Camera required. Prerequisite: Advanced Digital Photography.

PHOTOGRAPHY DESTINATION PHO 300115

Students will apply the knowledge and techniques they learned through the Introduction to Digital and Advanced Photography classes in a real-world exercise. The goal is for each student to produce several portfolio images and understand how to prepare and shoot on-location. Camera required. Prerequisite: Adobe Photoshop for Digital Photography.

PHOTOGRAPHY PRACTICUM PHO 300116

This advanced class will include location shoots and seated classes. The location shoots will include a portrait lighting demonstration and how to cover sporting events. Students will upload their images from the location shoots to create their own blog. Prerequisite: Photography Destination.

VISUAL STORYTELLING & PORTFOLIO DESIGN PHO 300117

The class will cover how to document stories through images. Students will complete a 5-10 image photo story that focuses on a theme, event, person, or social trend through a photojournalism style. This course will also cover how to feature the students' best work in a genre-specific print portfolio. Prerequisite: Photography Practicum.

EXCEL LEVEL | OST 310004

Learn to explore the Excel program window, edit, view, and print worksheets, work with formulas and functions, and learn how to format the contents of cells. This course will also teach students how to change the appearance of worksheets and discover the magic of Excel charting. Textbook required.

LEARN TO USE YOUR PC OST 312002

Learn the basics of using Microsoft® Windows. Students will work with MS Word to type letters and use Auto Correct, Copy and Paste, and other features. Students will also learn basic techniques to browse for, open, move and copy, and delete and restore files. Students will then move on to browsing the Web with Internet Explorer. Students will perform searches, interpret a list of keyword search hits, narrow your searches, and open multiple browser windows. Students will create and manage favorites. This course ends with a discussion of Webmail including Webmail messages, attachments, and create folders to store messages.

PowerShell is a cross-platform task automation solution made up of a command-line shell, a scripting language, and a configuration management framework.

They will also learn about the new Ribbon interface in Office and Windows' new operating system, Windows 10.







CISCO CERTIFIED NETWORK ASSOCIATE PROGRAM

These course are designed to prepare students for the CISCO CCNA 200 - 301 certification exam. The Cisco Certified Network Associate curriculum consists of three courses.

CCNA 1 INTRODUCTION TO NETWORKS

NET 310001

This course covers the fundamentals of networks and introduces students to the architecture, structure, functions, components, and models of computer networks. 

EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES

EMS Continuing Education courses are designed for new and already credentialed First Responders. Our current offerings include:

- Emergency Medical Responder (EMR)
 Initial course: 96+ hour seated
- Emergency Medical Technician Basic (EMT-B) Initial course: 240+ hour seated
- Paramedic (EMT-P)
 Initial course: 1200 hour seated
- Monthly 3+ hour Continuing Education classes for all levels taught at local fire departments throughout Stanly County
- Monthly 3 hour ONLINE or HYBRID Continuing Education topics for First Responders

These classes follow state and national guidelines designed to provide the EMS professional with options for continuing their learning, refreshing their skills, and meeting the hourly Continuing Education requirements.

EMERGENCY MEDICAL RESPONDER (EMR) EMS 410001

This course prepares individuals for the entry level of practice for a credentialed emergency medical service professional. Emergency Medical Responders provide immediate lifesaving care to critical patients who access the emergency medical services system. EMRs have the knowledge and skills necessary to provide immediate lifesaving interventions while awaiting additional EMS resources to arrive. EMRs also provide assistance to higher-level personnel at the scene of emergencies and during transport.

Requirements:

- •17 years of age on or before the official end date of the course.
- Possession of a high school diploma, high school equiv -alency or successful completion of an exam assessing basic reading comprehension skills at a minimum of the tenth-grade level.

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EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN (EMT)


EMS 4200110

This course prepares individuals to provide out-of-hospital emergency medical care and transportation for critical and emergent patients who access the emergency medical services (EMS) system. EMTs have the basic knowledge and skills necessary to stabilize and safely transport patients ranging from non-emergency and routine medical transports to life-threatening emergencies. These individuals perform interventions with the basic equipment typically found on an ambulance and function as part of a comprehensive EMS response system, under medical oversight. The EMT course includes classroom/lecture, lab, and clinical settings.

Requirements:

- 17 years of age on or before the official end date of the course.
- Possession of a high school diploma, high school equivalency or successful completion of an exam assessing basic reading comprehension skills at a minimum of the eleventh-grade level.

PARAMEDIC

A Paramedic is an allied health professional whose primary focus is to provide advanced emergency medical care for critical and emergent patients who access the emergency medical system. This 17-month program consists of 14 individual paramedic subject and clinical courses that when combined in sequence provides individuals with the foundational knowledge, skills and abilities to provide care for critical and emergent patients. Students will gain complex knowledge, competency, and experience while employing evidence-based practice under medical oversight. Graduates of this program will be eligible to take state and/or national certification examinations and be prepared to enter the workforce as an entry-level paramedic. Employment opportunities include emergency medical services, fire departments, rescue agencies, hospital specialty areas, industry, and educational and government agencies. Classes are taught two days per week, adding a day when clinicals begin.

Requirements:

- Students must possess a current North Carolina, NREMT, or other state's EMS credential prior to start of clinical (second eight weeks of the course).
- Possession of a high school diploma, high school equivalency.
- Successful completion of college-level English, or with in the previous 12 months complete a written assessment placing the individual into college-level English.
- Successful completion of college-level Math, or within the previous 12 months complete a written assessment placing the individual into college-level Math
- Student must complete a college-level Human Anato my and Physiology Course equivalent to Curriculum BIO 163 or higher. The Anatomy and Physiology course may be completed during the first semester of para medic course, but it is highly recommended that it be completed prior to starting paramedic course work.
- Background check, drug screen, and submission of immunization records.

ACTIVITY DIRECTOR HSE 326402

This course provides the NC Division of Facility Services-required training for activity directors in healthcare-related settings. Coursework includes synchronous online instruction that includes audience-specific activity planning, documentation, and assessment. Successful students qualify for employment as an activity professional in a skilled nursing facility or adult care home. A high school diploma (or equivalent) is required.

AMERICAN HEART ASSOCIATION BLS PROVIDER CPR AND AED SEF 300105

This course includes one- and two-rescuer cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR), use of a mask and bag-mask apparatus for adult, child, and infant CPR and AED use for adults and children. This course satisfies the CPR prerequisite for SCC Nursing and Allied Health programs. Classes are generally held monthly at the Crutchfield Education Center in Locust but may be offered in other locations based on community interest.

COMPUTED TOMOGRAPHY (CT) CAT 310001

This blended course includes 132 didactic hours (2 face-to-face, 130 online) and 304 clinical hours. Topics include CT procedures and equipment operation, patient care, patient history and assessment, contrast media usage, scout image, selectable scan parameters, and image processing. Students perform CT examinations and associated duties at various clinical sites under the supervision of CT technologists. Upon completion, students qualify for the American Registry of Radiologic Technologists exam in Computed Tomography. Students enrolling in the CT course must already be ARRT-registered or registry-eligible in Radiography, Nuclear Medicine Technology, or Radiation Therapy. A criminal background check, drug screen, and current immunization record are required by most clinical sites.

EKG TECHNICIAN ICV 311101

This course is designed for nurse aides and other healthcare personnel as an add-on skill training. The course prepares successful students to take the National Health Career Association's Certified EKG Technician Exam. Students learn the roles and responsibilities of an EKG technician, how to prepare patients for EKG analysis, and how to prepare EKG strips for review and analysis. American Heart Associations BLS Provider training is included.

MAMMOGRAPHY MAM 210001

This course provides a blend of online education and clinical experience for post primary practice in Mammography. A criminal background check, drug screen, and current immunization record are required by most clinical sites.

MEDICATION AIDE - LONG TERM CARE

PHM 410001

This course meets the requirements for the North Carolina Board of Nursing (NCBON) Medication Aide Registry. This registry listing allows nurse aides to administer medications to long-term care patients in skilled nursing facilities. Topics include oral, topical, and instillation medication routes; medical asepsis; hand hygiene; terminology; and legal implications. Students must have a high school diploma (or equivalent) and a current NC Nurse Aide registry listing.

MAGNETIC RESONANCE IMAGING (MRI)

NUR 335403

This course is designed to educate radiologic technologists in the post-primary practice of Magnetic Resonance Imaging. Online didactic hours and faceto-face clinical hours, include topics such as patient interactions and management, safety and screening, physical principles of image formation, sequence parameters and options, data acquisition and processing, and MRI procedures. Students will perform magnetic resonance examinations at various clinical sites under the supervision of MRI technologists. Successful students qualify for the American Registry of Radiologic Technologists (ARRT) post-primary exam in MRI. Enrollees must already be ARRT-registered or registry-eligible in Radiography, Nuclear Medicine Technology, or Radiation Therapy. A criminal background check, drug screen, and current immunization records are required by most clinical sites.

MEDICAL BILLING & CODING - HYBRID

OST 315001

This hybrid course prepares students for entry-level employment and optional certifications in medical billing and coding for physician's offices, hospitals and insurance companies. A blend of face-to-face meetings, online lessons and activities help students learn and apply medical terminology, medical billing, coding concepts and healthcare computer information systems. Proof of US high school diploma or equivalent required. Textbooks and current coding manuals required.

Costs include tuition (\$201.50), textbooks, and fees associated with criminal background check and current immunizations. The cost of the state registry exam is \$140. This course may qualify for the STWD Scholarship (see page 3 for more information).

NURSE AIDE I - BLENDED NAS 324002

This course consists of theory that is completed independently online, 13 days of lab held at the Crutchfield Education Center (Locust, NC) from 9am - 4pm on Fridays, and six Sunday clinicals at a long-term care facility in Albemarle. In this course, students learn basic nursing and personal care skills required to provide safe and competent care for individuals. Students achieving a satisfactory grade in theory, lab, and clinical will receive a Certificate of Completion and be eligible to test for listing on the NC Nurse Aide I Registry. Costs include tuition (\$206.50), textbooks, and fees associated with criminal background check and current immunizations. The cost of the state registry exam is \$140. This course may qualify for the STWD Scholarship (see page 3 for more information).

To qualify for registration, students must provide documentation of one of the following:

- High school diploma or equivalent AND CASAS score of 10th grade reading level or successful completion of college-level English course
- Possession of a high school diploma, high school equiv alency or successful completion of an exam assessing basic reading comprehension skills at a minimum at the tenth-grade level.

NURSE AIDE II NAS 324101

This course provides students with training in advanced Nurse Aide procedures. Upon successful completion of theory, lab and clinical, students will qualify as a Nurse Aide II with the NC Board of Nursing. This course may qualify for the STWD Scholarship (see page 3 for more information).

PHARMACY TECHNICIAN PHM 325003

This course prepares individuals to assist pharmacists in a variety of pharmacy settings. Successful students are eligible to take a certified pharmacy technician certification exam. Students must have a high school diploma (or equivalent) prior to course start date. This course may qualify for the STWD Scholarship (see page 3 for more information).

PHLEBOTOMY TECHNICIAN PBT 302201

Students must pass the theory portion of the course to be eligible to proceed to the clinical portion of the course. Successful completion of the course qualifies the student to apply for national certification through the American Society of Phlebotomy Technicians (ASPT). Costs include tuition, textbook, and fees associated with criminal background check, drug screens, and immunizations.



ADVANCED HOMICIDE INVESTIGATIONS CJC 500543

This course focuses on equivocal death investigation and how to successfully resolve the most complex homicide cases. Lead investigator roles and responsibilities including administrative requirements and prosecutorial considerations will be identified. Advanced investigative techniques will be applied to investigative theory along with an emphasis on proper case management. The concepts of "linkage", "linkage blindness", "time and distance", and "crime scene staging" will be explored. Crime scene reconstruction techniques and interrogation strategies for the homicide suspect will be taught. Child deaths, cold case investigations, and auto erotic deaths will be reviewed as well as the importance of recognizing "post offense behavior." The importance of the neighborhood canvass, hostile environments, common mistakes, and the need for "investigative conference" will be discussed.

ETHICAL LEADERSHIP CJC 505514

This 16 - hour/credit course discusses ethical behavior and leadership skills that are essential to policing in a democratic society. Coupled with ethical behavior, effective leadership ability places the police officer in the position of a powerful force to secure and maintain public safety and order. This course focuses on developing those leadership traits that incorporate the practice of doing the right thing, in the right way, for the right reasons.

DEATH INVESTIGATION CJC 500501

This course explores various types of natural, accidental, suicidal, and homicidal deaths that may be encountered along with proven investigative strategies for each type of case. Participants will learn a systematic process for handling the crime scene from the initial approach through scene documentation and evidence collection. Participants will learn how the latest technology and forensic sciences can assist you in your investigation. Different motivators for murder will be identified and compared to case examples, and follow-up investigative procedure and techniques will be identified.

FIELD TRAINING OFFICER CJC 501502

The purpose of this course is to provide the technical and personal skills to individuals for them to function as evaluators and trainers of recruits who have completed Basic Law Enforcement Training. This course should be attended by law enforcement officers who are or will be assigned to provide field training to new officers. The focus of this course is for patrol officers.

Course Objectives:

- Identify the significant components of the San Jose
 Field Training Officer model program.
- Objectively evaluate and document a trainee's field performance.
- Counsel and give constructive feedback to assist a trainee with improving performance.
- Identify and apply effective remedial training strategies to improve trainee performance.
- Identify techniques to improve FTO interpersonal com munication skills, maintain ethical standards and avoid civil liability while training.


 This course employs lecture, discussion, practical exer cises, and demonstrations.

FRONT LINE SUPERVISION FOR LE CJC 501501

This 40 hour /credit course will teach the experienced officer the basic concepts of management and employee relations by providing the knowledge and skills required to effectively supervise personnel within a law enforcement agency or detention facility. Topics covered include Introduction and Assessments, Leadership Essentials I, Effective Supervision, Effective Communications, Conflict Resolution, Working with Problem Employees, and Legal Issues for First Line Supervisors.

GENERAL INSTRUCTOR TRAINING CJC 392800

Criminal justice personnel planning to teach in any course mandated by either the Criminal Justice Education and Training Standards Commission or the Sheriffs' Education and Training Commission are required to successfully complete this course and apply for certification as a probationary general instructor. To attend this course and become a probationary general instructor, applicants must have a minimum of four years of practical criminal justice experience.











Course Objectives:

- Develop a lesson plan for the 70-minute block of instruction.
- Construct a lesson play for the 70-minute block of instruction.
- Teach a lesson play for the 70-minute block of instruction that efficiently utilizes audio visual aids.
- Successfully complete a written examination achieving a score a minimum of 75%.

Methodologies:

• This course employs discussion, programmed text, demonstration, and practice. Course Requirements: Attendance is required at all class sessions. The stu dent must develop a lesson plan for the 70-minute block of instruction with accompanying support mate rials, construct a test appropriate to the 70-minute block of instruction and teach a 70-minute block of instruction.

INTERVIEW AND INTERROGATION CJC 500508

This course covers basic and special techniques employed in criminal justice interviews and interrogations. Emphasis is placed on the interview/interrogation process, including interpretation of verbal and physical behavior and legal perspectives. Upon completion, students should be able to conduct interviews/interrogations in a legal, efficient, and professional manner and obtain the truth from suspects, witnesses, and victims.



LEADERSHIP FOR PATROL OFFICERS CJC 505516

This 8-hour course prepares patrol officers for leadership roles within their agency. Participants will learn the importance of leadership skills in law enforcement related to their unique interactions with the public, and how to effectively support the goals and objectives of their agency as leaders. Participants will also learn the importance of the leadership role and the influence and responsibility that comes with being a leader in law enforcement.

ROADSIDE CRIMINAL INTERDICTION TRAINING CJC 500013

This 24-hour course covers every facet of vehicle criminal interdiction by combining classroom and practical hands-on training. Topics include identifying physical indicators, legal issues, effective vehicle searches, identifying concealment locations/hidden compartments, and more. Practical exercises include a rotational seven-stage training exercise. Multiple exhibits and real-life training props will also be utilized including vehicles with electronically controlled false compartments.

CRIMINAL BEHAVIOR ANALYSIS CJC 500513

This class provides the street officer with tools to detect criminal behavior and enforce the law more effectively through increased understanding of the cognitive processes related to pattern detection, human behavior baselining and environmental analysis. The student is taught to use a systematic method of quantitative environmental observation to better identify deviations in behavior while recognizing threats both to the officer and the public.

SMI OPERATOR CERTIFICATION

Operator certification and recertification courses are offered for radar, time-distance, and lidar instruments.

Requirements for Certification:

- Must have Probationary or General Law Enforcement Certification.
- Must successfully complete a written exam with a passing score of 70%. If necessary, the student may retest within 90 days.
- Must successfully complete a performance test with a passing score of 100%. If necessary, the student may retest within 90 days.
- Lastly, the student must complete 16 hours of field practice with a trained officer.









Requirements for Recertification:

- Must meet all performance objectives listed in Requirements for Basic Certification.
- Must successfully complete a written exam with a passing score of 75%. No retest is allowed for the written exam and certification immediately terminates if the officer fails the exam.
- Must successfully pass a performance test with a passing score of 100%. If necessary, the student may retest within 90 days.
- If successful on the written exam and the performance test a three-year certification is issued.
- Supplemental Training rule applies for additional units not included in the Recertification Course.



BASIC LAW ENFORCEMENT TRAINING (BLET)

CJC 110

Basic Law Enforcement Training (BLET) is designed to give students essential skills required for entry-level employment as law enforcement officers with state, county, or municipal governments or with private enterprise. This program utilizes state commission mandated topics and methods of instruction. General subjects include but are not limited to criminal, juvenile, civil, traffic, and alcoholic beverage laws; investigative, patrol, custody, and court procedures; emergency responses; and ethics and community relations. Successful graduates receive a curriculum certificate and are qualified to take the certification examination mandated by the NC Criminal Justice Education and Training Standards Commission and/or the NC Sheriffs Education and Training Standards Commission.

BLET graduates can obtain entry level employment as law enforcement officers in North Carolina, including Sheriff's Offices, police departments, NC Wildlife, NC State Highway Patrol, State Bureau of Investigations, Department of Motor Vehicles and Alcohol Law Enforcement.





Electrical Lineworker


The Trades Facility will also allow SCC to provide additional trade programs not currently offered, including:
