



Certificate Paramedic Program (non-curriculum)

The Certificate Paramedic program provides individuals with the knowledge, skills and attributes to provide advanced emergency medical care as a paramedic for critical and emergent patients who access the emergency medical system and prepares graduates to enter the workforce.

Students will gain complex knowledge, competency, and experience while employing evidence-based practice under medical oversight. Paramedics are a vital component of the healthcare system.

Graduates of this program may be eligible to take state and national certification examinations. Employment opportunities include providers of emergency medical services, fire departments, rescue agencies, hospital specialty areas, industry, educational and government agencies.

Program Goal:

"To prepare Paramedics who are competent in the cognitive (knowledge), psychomotor (skills), and affective (behavior) learning domains to enter the profession."

Certificate Paramedic Program (non-curriculum)

Prerequisites for this course:

- Age 18 years or older
- High school diploma or high school equivalency.
- Possession of valid and active North Carolina or National Registry EMT credential.
- Successful completion of an approved college-level English course, or successful completion within the last 12 months of an entrance exam (RISE Written Assessment) placing student into college-level English, or successful completion of the ACT WorkKeys Assessment Gold Level.
- Successful completion of an approved college level Math course or successful completion within the last 12 months of an entrance exam (RISE Written Assessment) placing student into college-level Math, or successful completion of the ACT WorkKeys Assessment Gold Level.
- Successfully completion of one of the following Human Anatomy and Physiology Courses:
 - EMS-3163 Basic Anatomy and Physiology (when the course meets SACSCOC standards curriculum-level instructors), or
 - o BIO-163: Basic Anatomy and Physiology, or
 - o BIO-165 and 166: Anatomy and Physiology I and II (both sections), or
 - o BIO-168 and 169: Anatomy and Physiology I and II (both sections)
 - * The Anatomy and Physiology courses may be taken concurrently with paramedic courses beginning in the first semester, but this is discouraged. It is highly recommended that students complete Anatomy and Physiology prior to beginning paramedic courses due to the heavy paramedic course load.

Estimated Time Commitment and Cost:

The program consists of three consecutive semesters (approximately 12 months). This program will require approximately two full days (8a-5p) in class/lab each week, plus scheduled hospital and EMS clinical rotations. The Paramedic program is academically rigorous and will require a considerable commitment to reading, preparation, and study outside of class.

- Paramedic program courses will cost approximately \$180 for each subject course (tuition) plus approximately \$70 in required college fees each semester. There will be three to five subject courses each semester.
- Students affiliated with an emergency service organization (EMS, Fire, etc.) may qualify for a tuition waiver. A tuition waiver exempts the individual from paying continuing education tuition/registration fees. The waiver does not include any other fees or charges associated with these courses. Students are responsible for any associated course fees (student fees, textbooks, supplies, insurance, etc.).
- Textbooks for this program are available through the SCC bookstore for approximately \$2000.
- *Additional associated up-front costs for the program will include EMS Testing subscription \$100, Platinum Planner subscription \$100, Uniforms/Shirts/Equipment \$250, Background Check and Drug Screen \$120.
 - *Above fees are for contracted services and are subject to change.
- You will be required to take concurrent classes such as ACLS, PALS, and PHTLS which may be embedded in the paramedic courses. These classes will have additional certification fees associated with them.
