General UNC Articulation Agreement

Thanks to an articulation agreement between The University of North Carolina and the North Carolina Community College System, which includes Stanly Community College, SCC students can take select courses that will transfer to schools in the UNC system. The agreement applies to current SCC students enrolled in the nursing program, former SCC students, as well as any Registered Nurse with an ADN wishing to pursue a BSN degree at a UNC school of nursing. Uniform Articulation Agreement between North Carolina Independent Colleges and Universities RN to BSN Programs

The <u>Uniform Articulation Agreement</u> promotes educational advancement opportunities for registered nurses moving between North Carolina Community Colleges and the signatory campuses of the North Carolina Independent Colleges and Universities (NCICU) in order to complete Bachelor of Science in Nursing degrees.

This Registered Nurse to Bachelor of Science in Nursing Articulation Agreement (RN to BSN AA) is between the State Board of North Carolina Community Colleges and the signatory North Carolina Independent Colleges and Universities (NCICU) RN to BSN programs. It applies to all NC community colleges that operate associate degree nursing programs and to those ten signatory NCICU RN to BSN programs (Barton College, Cabarrus College of Health Sciences, Gardner-Webb University, Lees-McCrae College, Lenoir-Rhyne University, Mars Hill University, Pfeiffer University, Queens University of Charlotte, and University of Mount Olive).

Nursing students must apply and gain acceptance to a four-year institution in the UNC system in order to transfer credits. Although courses specified as part of the agreement generally transfer, students are encouraged to contact the institution they wish to transfer to in order to verify the specific courses and credits required.

Courses include:

- BIO 275 Microbiology 4 credit hours needed to transfer
- CHM 131 with 131A Introduction to Chemistry OR CHM 151 General Chemistry 4 credit hours needed to transfer
- ECO 251 Principles of Microeconomics OR 252 Principles of Macroeconomics AND POL 120 American Government 6 credit hours needed to transfer from this group
- ENG 231 OR 232 American Literature I or II 3 credit hours needed to transfer
- HIS 111 World Civilization OR HIS 131 American History I 3 credit hours needed to transfer
- MAT 143 Quantitative Literacy OR 171 Pre-calculus Algebra 3 credit hours needed to transfer
- MAT 152 Statistical Methods I 4 hours needed to transfer
- SOC 210 Introduction to Sociology 3 hours needed to transfer
- SOC 213 Sociology of the Family OR SOC 220 Social Problems 3 hours needed to transfer
- Humanities/Fine Arts courses 6 credit hours are needed to transfer and can be from the any of the following:
 - o ART 111 Art Appreciation
 - o ART 114 Art History Survey I
 - o ART 115 Art History Survey II
 - o MUS 110 Music Appreciation
 - o MUS 112 Introduction to Jazz
 - o PHI 215 Philosophical Issues
 - o PHI 240 Introduction to Ethics

Students will then complete 30-40 additional credits from a university in the UNC system for their BSN.
