

What is that class really about?

A CCP Guide to the College Transfer Classes

ACA 122

ACA 122 is a class about college. Have you ever wondered what the college offers to help you be successful? Have you wanted to know what it takes to transfer to a university? If so, this is the class that will help you find all of this information and more. ACA 122 takes a look at resources offered by the college as well as the policies and expectations a college has for its students. We will also look at long term plans for moving on to a University and how to pay for it when you get there. This is a great class to take as you begin your college career.

ART 111

Art 111 is a class where you learn about art. What makes certain pieces fall into certain stylistic periods? We will analyze different artistic styles, different artistic mediums like sculpture and painting. We will also look at how art has changed throughout time and how it is a reflection of the culture it came from. This class does not require you to create artwork but instead to appreciate art created by others.

BIO 111

Biology 111 is the first in a series of two general biology courses. This course primarily looks at life from the molecular and cellular level. We will look at how molecules and cells are the building blocks for all living creatures. We will also look at how the cells function and the jobs they do.

BIO 112

Biology 112 is the second of the two general biology courses. This class will expand on what was learned in Bio 111 to take a closer look at organisms. We will look at how organisms function and how they play a role in plant and animal systems. We will also take a look at ecology and evaluate how each organism plays a role in the system as a whole.

CHM 151

Chemistry 151 is the first in a series of two general chemistry classes. This class covers the structure of atoms and molecules and how they bond with one another. We will look at chemical bonding and how different solutions are formed. By the end of this class you should have a good understanding of chemical laws needed for evaluating chemical reactions.

CHM 152

Chemistry 152 is the second in the series of two general chemistry classes. This class continues to examine the fundamental laws and principals of chemistry. We will look at kinetics, equilibrium, chemical equations, acid base theory, electrochemistry, thermodynamics and complex ions. We will

also have an introduction into organic chemistry. By the end of class you should be able to proceed into higher level chemistry classes or in professions needing a chemical background.

CIS 110

CIS 110 is an introductory computer class. Topics in this class include the impact of computers on society, ethical issues, and hardware/software applications, including spreadsheets, databases, word processors, graphics, the Internet, and operating systems. By the end of the class, students should be able to use different computer applications to solve problems.

ECO 251

Economics 251 is a microeconomics class that looks at individual, business, and industry in the market economy. We will look at the role of the price of an item, supply and demand, costs and revenue, market structures, factor markets, income distribution, market failure, and government intervention. By the end of the class you should be able to evaluate an economic decision and make decisions based on the most efficient use of the resources allotted.

ENG 111

English 111 is a class where you really learn to write at a college level. We mainly write essays and focus on proofreading, revision, and avoidance of plagiarism in those essays.

ENG 113

In English 113 we learn about three different types of literature: fiction, poetry, and drama. We focus on the terms necessary to understand these types of literature and the research to write a literary research paper.

ENG 233

English 233 is a course that gives students the opportunity to travel through time through the eyes of some great American writers. We will start the class with a great American classic like *Huckleberry Finn*. Through these great novels we will also look at concepts such as regional realism and social realism. We conclude the class a contemporary novel that we can use to compare with the novels written during earlier periods of time.

HIS 111

History 111 is a history class that takes you on a ride from the beginning of time to around the 1600's. We will look at life, culture, times of conflict, and changes in civilization from cultures all over the world, including but not limited to Africa, America, Asia, the Middle East, Russia, and South America. This class will give you a pre-modern view of world civilizations.

SOC 210

Sociology 210 is the study of society and the impact it has on people's lives. The course starts with a look through history and seeing how society has affected the lives of people during a different era. We will also take a look at society today including a look at different cultures to see how this is helping shaping the people of today. We will use a lot of social media and technology since these are some of the factors influencing our society.

MAT 171

Math 171 is a Pre-Calculus Algebra college level course. We will take a deeper look into what a function is and what causes it to change. We will also study equations, systems of equations and inequalities as well as parametric equations. By the end of the class you should be able to use these different types of equations and functions to model real world problems and analyze the data you find.

MAT 172

This is the second of two Pre-Calculus classes with a focus on Trigonometry. In this class we will take a look at transcendental functions as well as their graphs. We will also use right and oblique triangle trigonometry. We will evaluate conic sections, vectors and polar coordinates. By the end of the class you will be able to use these tools to model and solve practical problems as well as analyze the solutions you find.

MAT 271

This course is a college level Calculus course. It is the beginning course in a three part sequence. In this class, we will cover limits, continuity, derivatives and integrals of algebraic and transcendental functions in one variable with applications.

PSY 150

Psychology 150 offers students the opportunity to explore intriguing questions such as, "Why do people behave that way?" and "How is personality developed?" We begin by exploring the history and several different approaches to psychology. Then move into current psychology and students continue to explore human behavior and thought processes. Learning is newly defined after exploring the brain from a neuropsychologist's point of view as well as how social psychologists explore social and cultural influences that shape learning.

SPA 111

Spanish 111 is a college level Spanish course that introduces the elements of the Spanish language (listening, speaking, reading and writing skills) within a cultural context. We will examine the different verbs and verb tenses. You will use your new skills to read, write, and talk in Spanish. We will also examine the culture of several Spanish speaking countries. You will also be required to take SPA 181 with this class.

SPA 181

Spanish 181 is the Spanish Lab and is required to be taken with the SPA 111 class. It is taught 100% online, students are required to purchase an access code (eBook) and have access to a headset and microphone in order to record their oral exercises. This lab gives you an opportunity to practice what you are learning in the class with listening activities, recorded oral exercises, and written assignments.
